Agency Description: The West African Relief Center (WARC) is a Seattle-based nonprofit organization dedicated to advancing the health, well-being, and economic stability of West African immigrant and refugee communities. WARC provides culturally responsive programs and services, including health access navigation, family support, youth development, civic engagement, and community education. Our mission is to ensure that West African families have the resources, support, and opportunities needed to thrive in King County.

Position Descriptions: WARC offers opportunities that support community outreach, youth development, housing assistance, and overall program operations. Volunteers may help with community engagement activities, youth advocacy and enrichment, assisting clients with housing resource navigation, and administrative tasks such as documentation, data entry, and organizing program materials.

Days and hours students can serve in this position: Monday – Friday, 9:00 AM to 5:30:00 PM Evening or weekend opportunities may be available for scheduled community events or workshops.

Minimum time commitment required of volunteers: 15–20 hours per academic quarter. Additional hours may be arranged, depending on program needs and student requirements.
